We begin April with better weather. Though signs of winter linger, spring is here to stay. Spring also brings with it the 2nd quarter and a continuation of our busy season at the Knights.

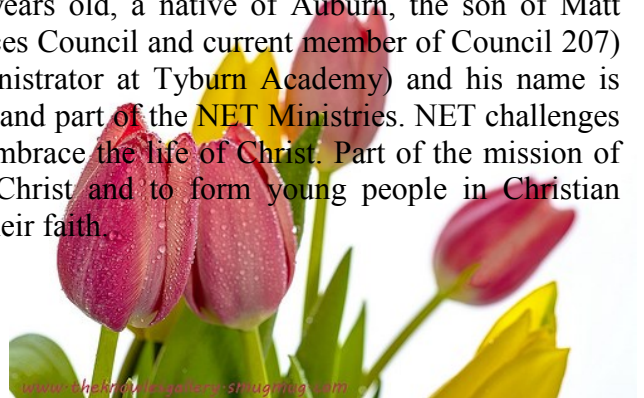

Preliminary results from the 1st quarter project a better than budget performance in gross vs expense %. Every % of improvement adds to our bottom line and enhances our ability

to "Give Back" to our community. Additional and more specific financial results are discussed at each monthly Council meeting.

News and Views: Results year over year continue to be very favorable, YTD March 2019 vs YTD March 2018 for both Council and Home Corp are within our fiscal budgets. Our gross \$'s in March were trending up vs. last year. Buy vs gross % continue as "Best in Class". The average past 3 months gross vs spend = 35%, vs the industry average of 41%. March is trending at 28%. Every % of improvement = increased profits for Council and increased charitable contributions. Our financial committee continues to meet each month. Mark Carr provides an update on our fiscal performance, YTD, for both Council and Home Corp. Detailed financial updates are available at monthly Council meetings. Home Corp. is current with all obligations to Council. Based upon performance, additional \$'s are being allocated from Home Corp. to Council in support of our initiatives and charitable contributions.

Activities in March were very strong with 38 events scheduled. Our rental contributions are the highest in several years. Many organizations are booking their events/meetings well into 2019. (Some now booking into 2020) It is very important that you contact Don Poole well in advance when booking an event. A debit/credit system was approved by Home Corp. We will delay implementation until we are fully staffed with additional bartenders. Our physical building is in need of repair over the next 1-5 years. In addition to the new roof we are in need of the following - painting inside and out - repair of outside rear wall - stove repair or replacement - coat parking lot - remove and replace rear landscaping - security system - new computer - reconfigure kitchen - replace ice machine - replace air conditioner (21 years old) repair outside walls, etc.. All have been identified at Council meetings and with in our finance committee . Plans are under way to prioritize and set up a schedule to proactively address all issues over the next 5 years. We will establish a budget and timeline and all will require Council approval. The capital improvement committee meet on March 25 to review the time frame to complete and the path forward.

Building Fund New Roof: Our special roof project is complete. We will have a special dedication ceremony, recognition and party for all that participated and donated. April/May 2019

Degree Updates: We are planning a 2nd Degree Ceremony during April/May. (Details to follow)

Membership Transfers: We continue to process member transfers from The St. Francis Council.

Membership: We have added 32 new 1st Degree and Transfer members YTD. 1/2 way + towards our goal of 50 new members in 2019.

Elections: Council + Home Corp elections will be held at Council prior to June 27 Council meeting. 3rd Degree members in good standing are eligible to run for election to open positions. (additional priority requirements may apply) details to follow in May newsletter and will also be posted at Council.

Please also contact Jack Baraczek, Bruce Sherman or Joe LoPiccolo for additional details.

By-Laws: Our Advocate, Patrick Carbonaro, has advised me that the current BY-Laws for both Council and Home Corp. require updating. Patrick has also reviewed same with our former Advocate, John Rossi. We will be working closely with Patrick, Jeff Gage, Mark Carr, Bruce Sherman, Pat Crawford, John Montone and Alex Vanderpool to begin the updating process. As a guide we will follow the current BY-Law and Charter Constitution Laws received by Supreme. This is a significant process and work is still underway to complete. We will continue to update on progress in future newsletters and Council meetings. We are also required by Supreme to comply with newly established guidelines for Councils with Home Corps. This process remains ongoing and we anticipate a draft document within the 1st qtr of 2019.

Grand Knight Suggestion Box: I am always interested in any and all suggestions and recommendations that are in the Best interest of Council 207. There is a Grand Knight Suggestion Box located at the table near the front door. Your input and ideas are welcome.

Christian Activities: We will continue to expand our involvement in Catholic Christian Activities throughout the year. Increased involvement by Council in activities at Tyburn Academy, St Joseph, Catholic Parishes, Champions for Life, Special Council Masses, Seminarians, Christian couple's events, Deacon Dennis Virtues events, local Pastors and Deacons, KOC Supreme special events and activities, Young men's group activities, etc. Important that we all work together to ensure success and sustainability for these projects now and in future years.

Work is complete in constructing a special permanent display area at the KOC to remind us all of our Catholic parishes and Catholic Christian affiliates and their roles in our faith community. Displays will be posted in the near future.

April 2019 Virtue of the Month

JUSTICE

Maura DelFavero, Principle of Tyburn Academy

Justice is the upholding and implementation of the law, impartiality, and fairness; it is getting what one deserves or giving to others what they deserve. It is a derivative of the Latin word *iustitia*. Justice is one of the four Cardinal Virtues: prudence, justice, temperance, and fortitude: the virtues which form the “hinges,” *cardones* in Latin, of a virtuous life. Plato listed these four virtues in the fourth book of his *Republic*; they are also known as the Pagan virtues because they are found to be honored in every great civilization, even polytheist ones. Words for these virtues may be found in every language, a sure sign of their universal applicability to human nature. St. Ambrose likens these Cardinal Virtues, including justice, to the four rivers of Paradise; Phison, Gihon, Tigris, and Euphrates, in his great work *On Paradise*. God’s Wisdom, the Logos, is the fountain of these virtues in the soul just as He created those rivers in Eden out of nothing. The Archangel Michael holds the scales symbolizing God’s justice in traditional iconography.

In the Old Covenant in the Old Testament Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Lot, Job, Ruth, and King Josiah are just before God; they give God His due and their fellow human beings theirs. In the New Covenant, which centers around Jesus the “Anointed One,” the “Just Man,” the “Upright Man,” and the Speaker of the Psalms through the Holy Spirit who suffers for the unrighteous and the wicked who murder him; the psalm he chants on the cross beginning “O Lord, why has Thou forsaken me?” ends in triumph and includes a very particular prophecy of men casting lots for his garments. Joseph is a truly just man and he, fittingly in the beginning of the Gospel Narrative, is described as being a just man for ignoring the letter of the Mosaic Law, which prescribed punishment for women like the Ever-Virgin Mary and Mother of God found with child before their marriage in the first chapter of the Gospel according to St. Matthew. So, too, with Joseph of Arimathea, the Centurion Cornelius whose “prayers and alms” were pleasing to God, Zacharias, his son St. John the Baptist, and Simeon the “just and devout.”

Justice is one of the attributes of the saints from ancient unto modern times: we all know, deep down, that St. Anthony of the Desert did not cheat and that Mother Teresa did not steal. A holy Eastern Monastic Elder named Paisios further distinguishes between Divine Justice and Human Justice. Divine Justice means forgiving injuries even before being asked and giving others better than they deserve. Divine Justice corresponds with the exalted, supernatural, teaching of the Gospel that one ought to love God and one’s neighbor, which are indeed to be found in the Pentateuch but bound up in extremely specific regulations, and human justice to the *lex talionis* or “an eye for an eye and tooth for a tooth” of the Mosaic Law as practiced by the Pharisees. Injustice, especially the oppression of the weak, the poor, and helpless by the wealthy and the strong, calls out to God for correction (c.f. the Book of Proverbs).

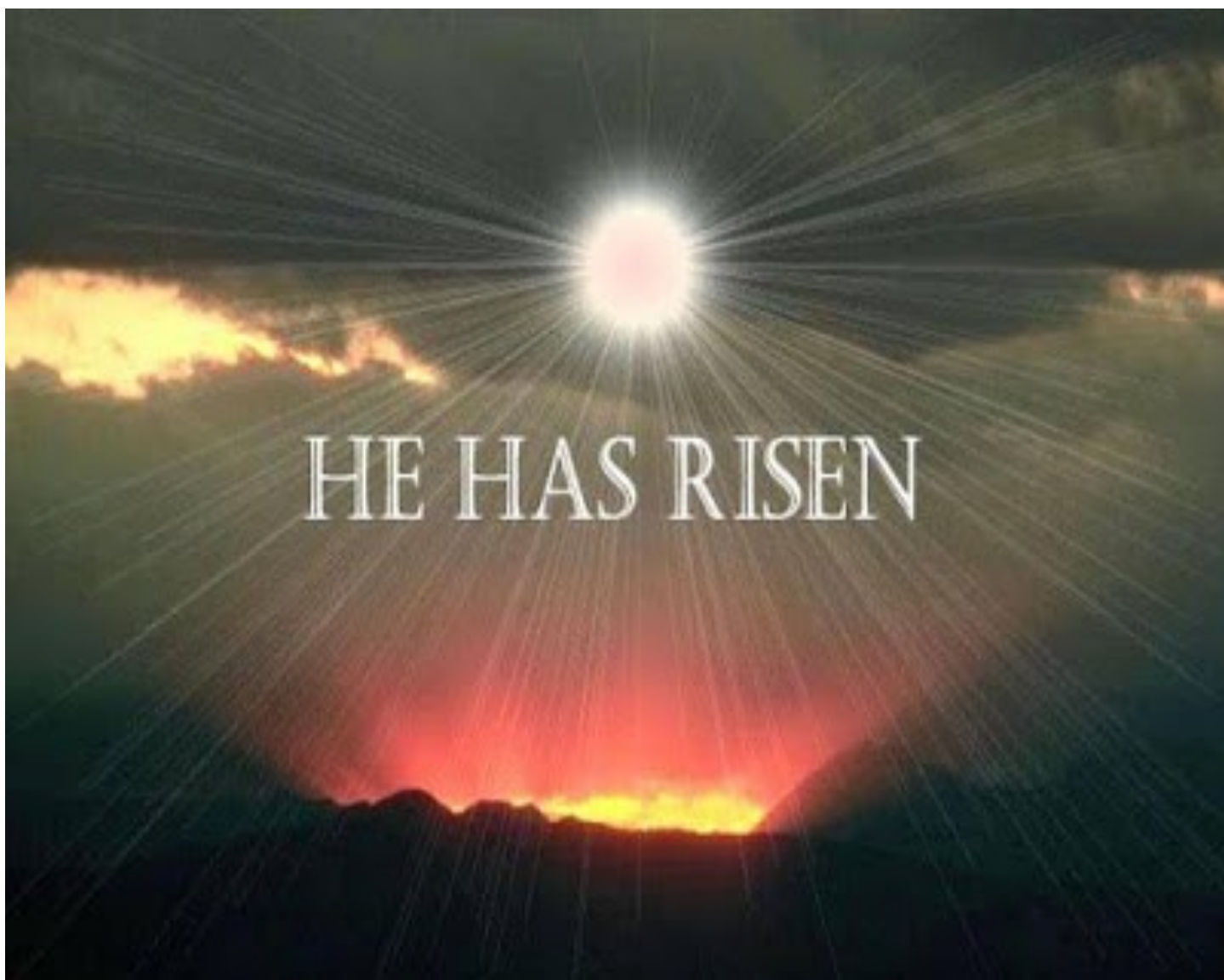

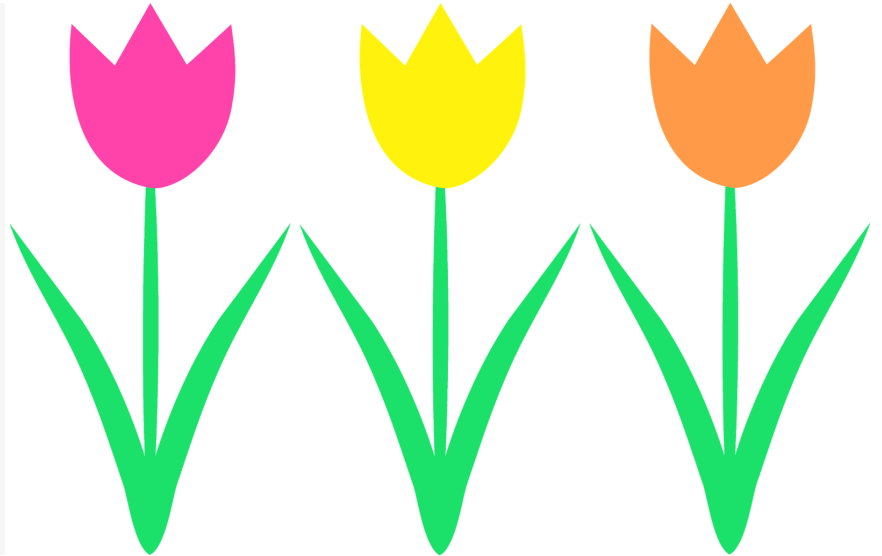
