BAR UPDATE FROM JIM LAMAY....

As always, thanks for your continued support, loyalty and patronage of Council 207. Our Brothers as well as Ladies Auxiliary are truly making a difference thru your participation and attendance at the Knights.



Though we are busy, we are beginning our slower season (July, August) We will be closed on Sunday's during July and August and will reopen Sunday's beginning in September. Should there be an event scheduled for July/August on Sunday we will provide the required support at the bar as needed. Always important to book early with Don Pole to secure a date. Memorial Day was a big hit with record revenue. Year over year monthly revenues and margins continue to be positive. May revenue was a little low vs last year. Spending in June as a % is in line vs gross receipts and continues to be better vs industry standards. Our spend vs gross avg. over the past 3 month = 36% vs an industry standard of 41%. Each % below 41% = additional margin.

We will continue to offer happy hour pricing each Friday - pizza etc. will also be provided. We are still looking to set up a bourbon and wine club in the fall. Minimal annual membership with quarterly tastings by local merchants and suppliers. Special wine and bourbon glasses for each individual joining. Additional ideas are welcome.

The St Baldrick's event on June 10 was a Big Hit. Very good revenue at the bar + the bartenders donated their time in support of St Baldrick's.

Summer is here !!!!! When it is hot outside or raining, the beer and other refreshments are cold here at Council. Stop by and have cold beer or beverage of your choice. You can't beat the stories, laughs and memories made. I look forward to seeing you soon and don't forget to bring a friend. Any recommendations or ideas you may have are always welcome.
