The Knights of Columbus

Founded by Father Michael J. McGivney in New Haven, Connecticut in 1882 The Knights of Columbus is the largest Catholic fraternal service organization. We have also grown to become the largest Catholic men's organization in the world. It should be noted that our own Council 207 will celebrate our 122 year anniversary in 2019. The number 207 has a lot of significance. The 207th Council formed in 1897. The 207th out of over 15,000 Councils in existence today. In my many travels and visits to other Councils the # 207 carries a lot of respect.

The Knights was formed as a mutual benefit society to help working class and immigrant Catholics in the United States. It developed into a fraternal benefit society dedicated to providing charitable services including war and disaster relief, defending Catholicism world wide and promoting Catholic education. There are over 2 million members world wide consisting of 4 Degrees. Supporting membership are over 15,000 Councils as well as 2,500 4th Degree Assemblies.

In addition to local charitable initiatives The Knights have charitable partnerships with Special Olympics, the Global Wheelchair Mission, Habitat for Humanity, Food for Families and Coats for Kids. (to name a few)

Our overall charitable contributions exceed \$180,500,000 yearly supported by 75 million hours + in volunteer hours of service.

We support for and love of our neighbors by helping those in need through food drives, soup kitchens, coat drives, our Christmas Appeal, food pantries, schools and Churches, St Baldricks, Breast cancer awareness, nursing homes, families in need and many more. I am proud to call you, our members, my Brothers.

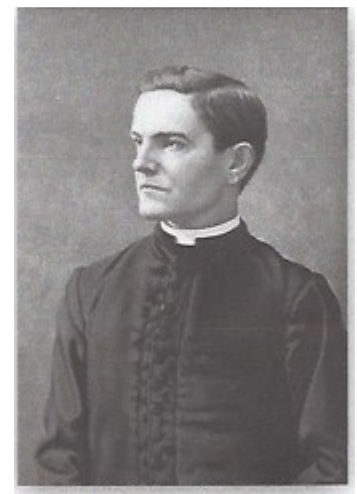

News and Views: Results year over year continue to be very favorable, YTD December 2018 vs YTD December 2017 for both Council and Home Corp are within our fiscal budgets. Our gross \$'s in December were up 16.7% vs last year. Buy vs gross % continue as "Best in Class". The average past 3 months gross vs spend = 27%, vs the industry average of 41%. Our best performance to date. Every % of improvement = increased profits for Council and increased charitable contributions. Our financial committee continues to meet each month. Mark Carr provides an update on our fiscal performance, YTD, for both Council and Home Corp. Detailed financial updates are available at monthly Council meetings. Home Corp. is current with all obligations to Council. Based upon performance, additional \$'s are being allocated from Home Corp. to Council in support of our initiatives and charitable contributions.

Activities in December were very strong. 45 events scheduled in December. Our rental contributions are the highest in several years. Many organizations are booking their events/meetings into 2019. It is very important that you contact Don Poole well in advance when booking an event. A debit/credit system was approved by Home Corp. We will delay implementation until we are fully staffed with additional bartenders. Our physical building is in need of repair over the next 1-5 years. In addition to the new roof we are in need of the following - painting inside and out - repair of outside rear wall - stove repair or replacement - coat parking lot - remove and replace rear landscaping - security system - new computer - reconfigure kitchen - replace ice machine - replace air conditioner (21 years old) repair outside walls, etc.. All have been identified at Council meetings and with in our finance committee. Plans are under way to prioritize and set up a schedule to proactively address all issues over the next 5 years. We will establish a budget and timeline and all will require Council approval. The financial committee meet on December 19 to review the time frame to complete and the path forward.

Building Fund New Roof: Our special roof project is complete. We will have a special dedication ceremony, recognition and party for all that participated and donated. 1st qtr 2019

Degree Updates: We have scheduled a 1st Degree on January 9 - candidates and sponsors arrive at 6:15 - Degree ceremony at 7:00 - Mark Carr and his Team are confirming all candidates and sponsors.

Membership Transfers: We have and will continue to welcome all transfers in good standing from the St Frances Council and have already processed 12 transfers. Council 207 has an opportunity to except transfers from approximately 60 Brothers. If you know of any Brothers from the St Frances Council that have questions regarding transfer process please have them contact either Matt Fallon (Gr Knight St Frances) or Myself. In the coming months I will post a list of new member transfers.

By-Laws: Our Advocate, Patrick Carbonaro, has advised me that the current BY-Laws for both Council and Home Corp. require updating. Patrick has also reviewed same with our former Advocate, John Rossi. We will be working closely with Patrick, Jeff Gage, Mark Carr, Bruce Sherman, Pat Crawford, John Montone and Alex Vanderpool to begin the updating process. As a guide we will follow the current BY-Law and Charter Constitution Laws received by Supreme. This is a significant process and work is still underway to complete. We will continue to update on progress in future newsletters and Council meetings. We are also required by Supreme to comply with newly established guidelines for Councils with Home Corps. This process remains ongoing and we anticipate a draft document with in the 1st qtr of 2019.

Additional Council members:

Plans are also underway to hold KOC Council 207 membership drives at the end of each Parish Mass early in 2019. We will be meeting with all parish priests in our area to review our program and obtain the necessary permission to proceed. We are also proposing to provide a coffee hour each quarter after Masses.

Grand Knight Suggestion Box: I am always interested in any and all suggestions and recommendations that are in the Best interest of Council 207. There is a Grand Knight Suggestion Box located at the table near the front door. Your input and ideas are welcome.

Christian Activities: We will continue to expand our involvement in Catholic Christian Activities throughout the year. Increased involvement by Council in activities at Tyburn Academy, St Joseph, Catholic Parishes, Champions for Life, Special Council Masses, Seminarians, Christian couple's events, Deacon Dennis Virtues events, local Pastors and Deacons, KOC Supreme special events and activities, Young men's group activities, etc. Important that we all work together to ensure success and sustainability for these projects now and in future years.

Work is complete in constructing a special permanent display area at the KOC to remind us all of our Catholic parishes and Catholic Christian affiliates and their roles in our faith community. Displays will be posted in the near future.

Notable Events: Planned events for 2019 - sports night - casino night - clam/seafood night, Old timers recognition dinner - Wine Tasting - bourbon tasting - Past Grand Knight cocktail hour - KOC Mass Dedication at Sacred Heart Church - Police Officers/Firemen recognition day - Pancake breakfasts - Mass at KOC - I have met with Father Brown at Sacred Heart/Saint Ann's and plans are also under way to host a "Special Mass" of recognition for Council 207. If anyone has Council 207 memorabilia, please advise me "ASAP" - Rosary prayer service prior to Council meetings - Membership drive local and after Masses

The Virtue of Month

Gratitude

When I met my wife, she was the foster mother of two children. Often, I would be present for night prayers. One of the steps in the prayer process was sharing what they were grateful for. They commonly shared that they were grateful for their pillows and blankets and running water. What seems common place to us they didn't have with their biological parents. Prior to meeting my wife, I worked as a youth minister and twice I took a group of teens to Ecuador to a place called the Damien House. When we arrived, the residents were all gathered together with signs, singing, and sharing how grateful they were for us coming to spend time with them, and all we did was show up.

These two moments in my life have profoundly affected me in my understanding of gratitude. I grew up with blankets and pillows, but I never said thank you for them. Throughout my life I would visit family and friends, but no one was holding a welcome sign at the door. Mags Blackie says "Gratitude is an acknowledgement of the continual gifting of God. And my expression of gratitude probably doesn't begin with saying "Thank you." Rather it begins in the savoring of what I have, in the celebration of the life that is. As I begin to savor and to celebrate, I start to look around for those whom I should include in my thanksgiving. I cannot help but turn my attention to God."

Early Intervention at Champions for Life Sports Center

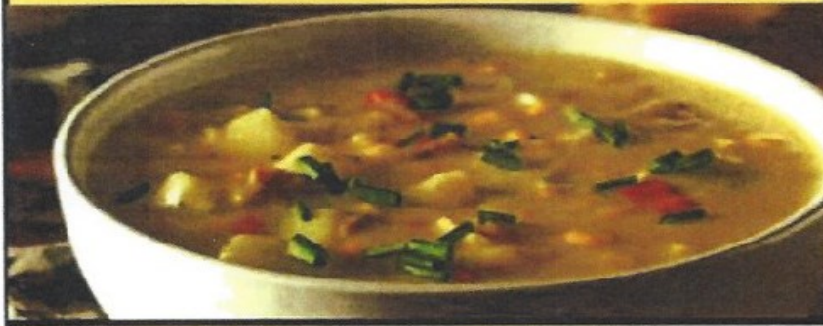

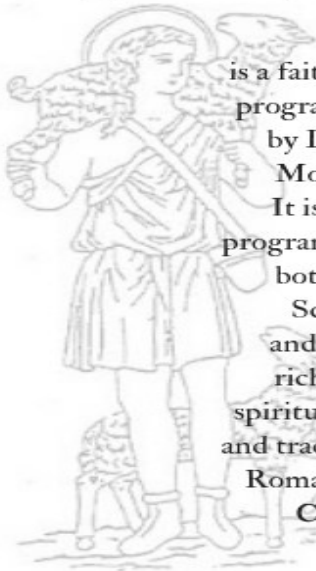

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd



is a faith formation program designed by Dr. Maria Montessori. It is a unique program founded in both Sacred Scripture and Liturgy: rich with the spiritual teachings and traditions of the Roman Catholic Church.
