News and Views: Results year over year continue to be very favorable, YTD May 2018 vs YTD May 2017 for both Council and Home Corp are within our fiscal budgets. Buy vs gross % continue as “Best in Class”. The average past 3 months gross vs spend averaged 31-34% or 17% better, vs the industry average of 41%. Every % of improvement = increased profits for Council and increased charitable contributions. Our financial committee continues to meet each month. Mark Carr provides an update on our fiscal performance, YTD, for both Council and Home Corp. Detailed financial updates are available at monthly Council meetings. We reviewed our 1st Draft budget for fiscal 2018/19. All looks very positive and we are panning on growth of approximately 7%. Activities in May were 47. Many organizations are booking their events/meetings well into 2018 with some now in 2019. It is very important that you contact Don Poole well in advance when booking an event. A debit/credit system was approved by Home Corp. We are in the final stages of comparing several systems and will report on our findings.

Our physical building is in need of repair over the next 1-5 years. In addition to the new roof we are in need of the following - painting inside and out - repair of outside rear wall - stove repair or replacement - coat parking lot - remove and replace rear landscaping - security system - new computer - reconfigure kitchen - replace ice machine - replace air conditioner (21 years old) - more to come on these items. Over time we will establish a budget and timeline and all will require Council approval.

Building Fund New Roof: So far we have received \$20,000 + from 85 individuals. Thanks to all for your contributions. Our roof campaign is considered a “Special” building fund campaign given the costs associated for this major project. (approximately \$30,000.00) We are also expected to incur additional maintenance costs to our building this year beyond the roof project and anticipate that we can cover these costs thru the existing building fund. Our roof campaign will run through July 2018. REMINDER: All contributions are tax deductible. Additional updates and reminders will be forthcoming.

Degree Updates: We have a place holder for another 1st Degree on June 26th depending on applications and commitments. Additional detail to follow. We will conduct 2 additional First and Second degrees in 2018. Details to follow. Contacts: 1st and 2nd Degree - Jack Baraczek at 315-415-5325, Bruce Sherman 315 567-9677, Joe LoPiccolo, 315-246-8943, ASAP, for details. Pre-registration is required.

By-Laws: Our Advocate, Patrick Carbonaro, has advised me that the current BY-Laws for both Council and Home Corp. require updating. Patrick has also reviewed same with our former Advocate, John Rossi. We will be working closely with Patrick, Jeff Gage, Mark Carr, Bruce Sherman, Pat Crawford, John Montone and Alex Vanderpool to begin the updating process. As a guide we will follow the current BY-Law and Charter Constitution Laws received by Supreme. This is a significant process and work is still underway to complete. We will continue to update on progress in future newsletters and Council meetings. We are also required by Supreme to comply with newly established guidelines for Councils with Home Corps.

Additional Council members: Our goal will be to add 50 new 1st Degree members in 2018. This will require adding 12-14 new members each quarter. We will also encourage current 2nd and 3rd Degree Members to move to the net level. The Ladies Auxiliary has also increased their membership to 170 and anticipate continued growth in 2018.

New look: Improvements and reconfigurations continue at Council. Reconfiguration of the back office will complete our updating by year end. Volunteers needed for some sweat equity to refresh the outside of our building along with some painting and general housekeeping.



NOTE: Use of our facility by members and guests is “Welcome” - please police all areas that are used and ensure that all items used are returned to their original location(s). Thank you.

Events: It is very important that you schedule your event “ASAP” with Don Poole. Depending on the event, we can also host multiple events at the same time. We continue to host simultaneous events in the front room + the main bar area + the back room.

BAR UPDATE FROM JIM LAMAY....



As always, thanks for your continued support, loyalty and patronage of Council 207. Our Brothers as well as Ladies Auxiliary are truly making a difference thru your participation and attendance at the Knights.

We were really busy in May. Activities for May remained strong however revenue was little less vs last year (7 bereavements last May vs 0 this year). Always important to book early with Don Pole to secure a date. Memorial Day was a big hit with record revenue.

Year over year monthly revenues and margins continue to be positive. May revenue was a little low vs last year. Spending in May as a % is in line vs gross receipts and continues to be better vs industry standards. Our spend vs gross avg. over the past 3 months = 31-34% vs an industry standard of 41%.

We started Tuesday "Specials" in May (\$1.00 Hoffman hot dogs - \$1.00 make your own tacos - \$1.00 chili - etc. \$1.00 12oz domestic draft beer) 5:00 - 7:00. Not a big hit as of yet. Other establishments are also hosting Tuesday specials. Lets see where it goes.


