Here comes June, I think. Why do some days still feel like April? Better weather and the vacation season are just around the corner. We to at The Knights will be going into our slower season months during July and August (though the past two summer seasons stayed pretty busy). There will be no Council meetings during July/August. Officers and Trustees will continue to meet over the summer months. The official start of summer also begins on June 21.

I would also like to also apologize for the lateness of the June newsletter. Technical difficulties (my computer was one of the culprits), delays in content, schedules etc. all played a role. We all learn from these situations and do better in the future. (NOTE: July/August newsletters will be combined as in the past.

Activities continue to remain strong thru June. Many thanks go out to all the volunteers that helped to ensure another very successful Memorial Day celebration and open house at The Knights. Our day started with set up at 7:30 AM with many leaving to attend Mass at St Joseph's Cemetery at 9:00. 800+Hoffman hotdogs+500 water/soda bottles+200 snack bags not to mention a very robust bar crowd ensured a very successful day. 5000+ candy treats were also distributed by our volunteers from the KOC firetruck during the parade. Special thanks for the support of Lee and Paul Vanderpool for again sponsoring the firetruck on behalf of The Knights.

Our gross revenue as well as margin contributions are again in line with budget expectations. Preliminary results YTD project a better than budget performance in gross vs expense %. Every % of improvement adds to our bottom line and enhances our ability to "Give Back" to our community. Additional and more specific financial results are discussed at each monthly Council meeting and are logged into our Council agenda and minutes. We will also be finalizing our June year end budget and P&L as well as preparing for our year end audit and update to Supreme. Final year end results will be available by the end of July. We will also be preparing the fiscal budgets and P&L budgets for our new fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020.

Several dates in June are also significant.

June 2-Ascension Sunday, June 6-75 Anniversary of the D Day Invasion, June 14-Flag Day, June 16 -Fathers Day- A very special day to honor our Fathers and Father Figures—Our Fathers are our heroes, role models, friends, Christian influence, shoulder to cry on, protector of our Family, fishing, hunting buddy, the know it all and can do it all guy and on and on and on. A father carries pictures in his wallet where money used to be. The older I get the more I realize the role that Dad played in my life always going above and beyond without hesitation. Thanks to all of our Father Figures. We honor and celebrate you not only on Fathers Day but each and every day of the year. June 21-Start of Summer, June 23-Most Holy Body and Look of Christ, June 24-St John the Baptist feast day, June 28-Sacred Heart of Jesus, June 28-feast of St Pater and Paul.

The month of June is also specifically dedicated to The Sacred Heart of Jesus. The beginning of June also falls with in the liturgical season of Easter represented by the color white - a symbol of light, joy, purity and innocence. The rest of June falls with in the season of ordinary time represented by the color green - a symbol of hope, sprouting seeds, hope in the eternal harvest of heaven and of the glorious resurrection. The Holy Father also offers special intentions for June and the mode of life of Priests. This June 6th also marks the 75th Anniversary of the D Day Invasion of Normandy. On June 6 1944 the largest amphibious military assault in history took place on a 50 mile stretch of the Normandy beaches. Over 175,000 men landed supported by 6,939 allied ships and 11,590 allied planes . 4,414 allied troops died on that day with estimates of over 10,00 total casualties killed, wounded or missing. Many serviceman from Auburn lost their lives during WW2 but of special significance was the 299th Combat Engineers Battalion made up of 660 men mostly from the Upstate NY area to include 63 from Auburn, NY. On D Day the Battalion lost 1/3 of its men to include 6 from Auburn. Nicholas V. DeAngelis, Leo A. Indelicato, John R. Spinelli, Thomas J. Phillips, Claude D. Brown Jr., Lawrence A. Roberts all made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of their country. With in 5 days the Allied's landed over 350,000 troops. Let us never forget the sacrifices made by thousands of service men and women that defeated the evils of the Nazi regime in order to guarantee the freedom of all nations as well as the Democracy and freedom that we live in and enjoy today in the United States. God Bless.

We all have our stories to tell about relatives and others that took part in the D Day invasion. My Father was part of the D Day invasion and was wounded in combat in Belgium for which he earned a Purple Heart as well as other medals. I am very interested in hearing about the stories of our friends and relatives that served not only in WW2 but as well as in other conflicts. Perhaps we can gather at some point and memorialize these stories and make them part of our Veterans wall at The Knights. Let me know your thoughts.

Degrees. I am pleased to announce that we will be hosting three (3) Degree Ceremonies this fall. 2nd Degree in September, 3rd Degree in October and 4th Degree in November. A great opportunity to attend additional Degree Ceremonies right here in Auburn. As an example we currently have over 200 2nd Degree Brothers. Details contained with in the newsletter.

I will close with a special announcement. After much thought, contemplation and soul searching I have decided to reconsider and run for Grand Knight again. My work for The Knights incomplete. Yes we have grown in many positive ways, however, many of the areas that I expected to significantly improve including growing our membership and growing youth programs still need work. We are also close to announcing candidates for Deputy Grand Knight. A vital role in the path for Grand Knight that would require some mentoring. So, if elected, my role as Grand Knight will continue. Thanks for your understanding and support and I am always happy to answer any questions that you may have.

NOTE: Reminder - elections for Council 207 and Home Corp. will take place prior to our June Council meeting on Thursday June 27, 2019. Election ballots will be posted in the May/June Newsletter as well as at Council.

In closing a reminder that our faith is about new beginnings and giving not only occasionally but each day throughout the year.

Ongoing Updates: Please forward additional weekly update request directly to Rich Kloster each Monday. E mail updates will be sent to all Council members + Ladies Auxiliary members that have an e mail on file. We are also looking for a volunteer to assist Rich in updating the council web site.

News and Views: Results year over year continue to be very favorable, YTD May 2019 vs YTD May 2018 for both Council and Home Corp are within our fiscal budgets. Our gross \$'s in May were higher vs. last year (+4%). Buy vs gross % continue as "Best in Class". The average past 3 months gross vs spend was higher vs the norm due to several quarterly and annual payment due. May was back in line at 36%. Every % of improvement = increased profits for Council and increased charitable contributions. Our financial committee continues to meet each month. Mark Carr provides an update on our fiscal performance, YTD, for both Council and Home Corp. Detailed financial updates are available at monthly Council meetings. Home Corp. is current with all obligations to Council. Based upon performance, additional \$'s are being allocated from Home Corp. to Council in support of our initiatives and charitable contributions.

Activities in May remained strong with 31 events scheduled. Our rental contributions are the highest in several years. Many organizations are booking their events/meetings well into 2019 and some booking into 2020. It is very important that you contact Don Poole well in advance when booking an event. A debit/credit system was approved by Home Corp. We will delay implementation until we are fully staffed with additional bartenders and expect to launch during the quieter months this summer. Our physical building is in need of repair over the next 1-5 years. In addition to the new roof we are in need of the following - painting inside and out - repair of outside rear wall - stove repair or replacement - coat parking lot - remove and replace rear landscaping - security system - new computer - reconfigure kitchen - replace air conditioner (21 years old) repair outside walls, etc.. All have been identified at Council meetings and with in our finance committee. Plans are under way to prioritize and set up a schedule to proactively address all issues over the next 5 years. We will establish a budget and timeline and all will require Council approval. We are currently receiving bids for the early projects. We have also reached an agreement with NYSEG to replace all interior and exterior light fixtures and switches with state of the art LED lights. NYSEG will cover 2/3 of the overall cost. Council approved motion to accept bid from NYSEG and complete work. 100% all in favor at May Council meeting.

Degree Updates: Scheduled in Auburn - 2nd Degree Ceremony September 24 Council 207 - 3rd Degree Ceremony October 5th (Church location TBD) - 4th Degree Ceremony November 2 (Church location TBD) - candidates must be a Brother in good standing - this is a great opportunity to enhance your current Degree status - important that you contact Jack Baraczek (315 415-5325) Alex Vanderpool (315 567-9659) or Joe LoPiccolo (315 246-8493) asap with your intentions to attend Degree Ceremonies - A great opportunity to attend all 3 Degrees this fall right here in Auburn, NY.

Membership Transfers: We continue to process member transfers from The St. Francis Council as well as from other Councils.

Membership: We have added 34 new 1st Degree and Transfer members YTD. 68% towards our goal of 50 new members in 2019. Plans are underway to host membership drives at our local Churches in the upcoming months. All candidates must be sponsored by an existing Brother Knight in good standing.

By-Laws: Our Advocate, Patrick Carbonaro, has advised me that the current BY-Laws for both Council and Home Corp. require updating. Patrick has also reviewed same with our former Advocate, John Rossi. We will be working closely with Patrick, Jeff Gage, Mark Carr, Bruce Sherman, Pat Crawford, John Montone and Alex Vanderpool to begin the updating process. As a guide we will follow the current BY-Law and Charter Constitution Laws received by Supreme. This is a significant process and work is still underway to complete. We will continue to update on progress in future newsletters and Council meetings. We are also required by Supreme to comply with newly established guidelines for Councils with Home Corps. This process remains ongoing and we anticipate a draft document with in the 1st qtr of 2019.

Grand Knight Suggestion Box: I am always interested in any and all suggestions and recommendations that are in the Best interest of Council 207. There is a Grand Knight Suggestion Box located at the table near the front door. Your input and ideas are welcome.

Christian Activities: We will continue to expand our involvement in Catholic Christian Activities throughout the year. Increased involvement by Council in activities at Tyburn Academy, St Joseph, Catholic Parishes, Champions for Life, Special Council Masses, Seminarians, Christian couple's events, Deacon Dennis Virtues events, local Pastors and Deacons, KOC Supreme special events and activities, Young men's group activities, etc. Important that we all work together to ensure success and sustainability for these projects now and in future years.

Work is complete in constructing a special permanent display area at the KOC to remind us all of our Catholic parishes and Catholic Christian affiliates and their roles in our faith community. Displays will be posted in the near future.

Notable Events: Planned events for 2019 - sports night - casino night - clam/seafood night, Old timers recognition dinner - Wine Tasting - bourbon tasting - Past Grand Knight cocktail hour - KOC Mass Dedication at Sacred Heart Church - Police Officers/Firemen recognition day - Pancake breakfasts - Mass at KOC - I have met with Father Brown at Sacred Heart/Saint Ann's and plans are also under way to host a "Special Mass" of recognition for Council 207. If anyone has Council 207 memorabilia, please advise me "ASAP" - Rosary prayer service prior to Council meetings - Membership drive local and after Masses - coffee hour after Masses - membership drive

Elections: Council + Home Corp elections will be held at Council prior to June 27 Council meeting 4:00 - 6:30. 3rd Degree members in good standing are eligible to run for election to open positions. (additional priority requirements may apply) details to follow in June newsletter and will also be posted at Council. 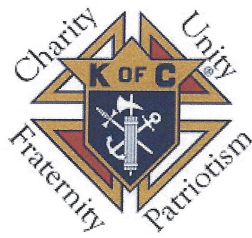

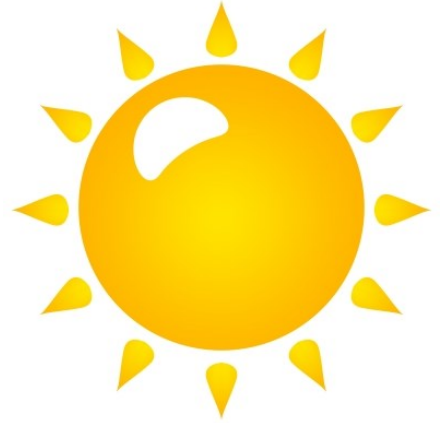
