I will start by saying “yes it’s been awhile since our last newsletter”. Given my current health issues and mandate from my Wife, my Family and my physician to “Slow Down” I reluctantly followed their advise. I am back though and will do my best to publish our newsletters thru June with the always present help of Sue Conway who always does a Great Job of putting all that I send her into a working document for publication.

These past few months have been very active at The Knights as our busy season continues through June. Bookings and events continue to be very strong with many events booked thru year end and some into 2021.

Highlights from the past several months include: The Pink Party Carol Baldwin Cure for Breast Cancer event sponsored by The Ladies Auxiliary - Knights/Tyburn SU sports banquet - The Knights meat raffle + \$100 raffle + Christmas Appeal (we distributed approx. \$7,000.00 to needy families, parishes, food pantries etc.) - Hosting the 3rd and 4th Degrees in Auburn - Kentucky Derby Ladies Auxiliary party - SU/ Notre Dame get together - Veterans Day After celebration - Caroling at nursing homes (our own Jeff DeChick makes a great Santa) - New Years Day dues collection kick off - Operation Enduring Gratitude 3 launch - Knights Soup Kitchen - Ash Wednesday services at The Knights - Friday Fish dinners - etc./etc./etc. - these are just some of the highlights. With help from our volunteers, benefactors and sponsors Brothers and Ladies Auxiliary we, by working together, can “Make a Difference” in our Community.

Our gross revenue as well as margin contributions are again in line with budget expectations. Results for fiscal YTD are in line with budget expectations. Every % of margin improvement adds to our bottom line and enhances our ability to “Give Back” to our community. Additional and more specific financial results are discussed at each monthly Council meeting and are logged into our Council agenda and minutes.

The month of February also ushers in one of the most sacred times of our Catholic faith. Beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 26 the Catholic Church begins the process of preparing “Us” to better appreciate the death and resurrection of Christ through repentance, prayer, self examination, fasting and self denial. We are reminded that as the priest makes the sign of the cross on our foreheads we should remember that “dust thou art, and unto dust you shall return”.

During our Ash Wednesday services at The Knights, Deacon Mike (Deacon Mike Evans from St. Peter and Paul Ukrainian Catholic Church) offered us all a challenge. “Lent is a time for fasting, giving up, sacrificing, and doing without. Though important let’s also give back as well as we give up. Let’s give back to others in need. Let’s work to make a positive difference in the lives of others”. Thank you Deacon Mike for your advise and also for presiding over our annual Ash Wednesday Service.



Pope Francis during his Ash Wednesday speech added a modern twist to the list of things to quit during Lent and beyond. "It is time to give up useless words, gossip, rumors, tittle-tattle and speak to God on a first name basis". Fasting and reflection are important but we must also practice more good deeds, alms giving and be particularly closer to the needy.

Lent is also the process that leads us to a celebration. The Celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead. The most important holiday in the Christian Calendar. The end of Holy Week and the beginning of the Easter Season lasting seven weeks and ending with Pentecost.

Yes, Easter will be a time to celebrate but let us also celebrate Lent as a time of "Giving back to others".

I am also please to announce that we had special visitors from The Catholic Courier. Jennifer Burke, an editor from The Catholic Courier, recently interviewed me in reference to our weekly soup kitchens for the needy. Jennifer was most interested in our process, content, start and foundation and our Council's giving back to the Community that we serve. Subsequent to Jennifer's interview a photographer from The Courier was dispatched to photograph our Council at work during one of our Tuesday soup kitchen events. Jennifer also interviewed several of our volunteers. Council 207 and our Ladies Auxiliary are expected to be featured in a future article of The Courier. A job well done.

NOTE: In addition to serving, hearty soup, we also provide bread/butter, water, deserts, PBJ sandwiches, containers to go for an extra meal, winter clothing and bus money as needed.

The Knights of Columbus is also a member of our community "Hunger Task Force", a founding member and one of 7 organizations that provide meals to those in need seven (7) days a week.

I also enjoy traveling to other parishes and Councils. I recently attended Mass at St. John the Evangelist Church in Naples, Florida. A magnificent Church, Parish and Catholic Youth Center to include 36 different ministries, social groups, support groups and prayer groups. A very large Parish with weekly collections of \$63,000.00. (Yes, \$63,000.00/week is not a misprint) I also attended The Knights of Columbus Council 11281 Council meeting. With 240 members their Council format, structure and meeting agenda is the same as Council 207 however we have significantly more activities ongoing. I found their meeting very interesting with some creative fundraising plans that I will recommend to our Council. They were also very welcoming of my attendance, interested in our activities and were most impressed with the #207 and our 121 years as a Council. I would encourage our Brothers to visit other Councils in your travels as can provide a wealth of information and Brotherhood.

In closing, thanks to all of you for your time in reading our newsletter. I am always interested in your suggestions, ideas as well as input. I am also so Very Proud to be part of the Very Best Knights of Columbus Council - Council 207 as well as the Very Best Ladies Auxiliary.

News and Views: Results year over year continue to be very favorable, YTD February 2020 vs YTD February for both Council and Home Corp are within our fiscal budgets. Our gross \$'s in February were even with last year. Buy vs. gross % continue as "Best in Class". The average past 3 months gross vs spend was below industry standards. February was approx. 34%. Every % of improvement = increased profits for Council and increased charitable contributions. Our financial committee continues to meet regularly. Mark Carr provides an update on our fiscal performance, YTD, for both Council and Home Corp. Detailed financial updates are available at monthly Council meetings. Home Corp. is current with all obligations to Council.

Activities in February remained strong with 31 events scheduled. Our rental contributions are the highest in several years. Many organizations are booking their events/meetings well into 2020 and some booking into 2021. It is very important that you contact Don Poole well in advance when booking an event. A debit/credit system was approved by Home Corp. We will delay implementation until we are fully staffed with additional bartenders and expect to launch during the quieter months later this spring. Our physical building is in need of repair over the next 1-5 years. We are in need of the following - painting inside and out - repair of outside rear wall - stove repair or replacement - coat parking lot - remove and replace rear landscaping - security system - new computer - reconfigure kitchen - replace air conditioner (21 years old) repair outside walls, etc.. All have been identified at Council meetings and with in our finance committee. Plans are under way to prioritize and set up a schedule to proactively address all issues over the next 5 years. We will establish a budget and timeline and all will require Council approval. We are currently receiving bids for the early projects. We have also replaced all of our standard light fixtures with new LED fixtures and lights, both inside and outside. Better and more even light distribution along with cost savings.

Soup Kitchen: We have been interviewed by an editor from the Catholic Courier reference our weekly soup kitchens for the needy. The Courier also sent in a photographer to take pictures of our Tuesday Soup Kitchen on February 18. We will be featured in a future article in the Catholic Courier.

Degree Updates: - As a reminder our Degree Ceremonies have changed effective February 2020. Supreme has issued new directives that must be followed by all Councils. The new Degrees will incorporate the 1st+ 2nd+3rd Degrees into one Degree Ceremony. Degree Candidates and their sponsors may invite Family and Friends to attend Degree Ceremonies. As a consequence we have postponed our February 1st Degree until further notice. I, along with other Degree Team members will be attending a Degree Ceremony workshop on March 10. We will announce a new Degree Ceremony for all candidates in the near future. (currently we have 24 new candidates) All current 1st or 2nd Degree Brothers, in good standing, can also sign up to attend the new Degree Ceremony and advance their individual Degree status. This will be a great opportunity to enhance your current Degree status or attain the 1-3 Degrees during one combined Degree Ceremony. Membership Transfers: We welcome any transfer members in good standing from other Councils. If you are aware of any Brothers that would like to transfer to Council 207, please contact Joe Lopiccolo, Mark Carr or Myself.

Membership: We added 46 new Brothers in 2019. Our goal will be to add 50 new Brothers and or transfers in 2020. Plans are underway to host membership drives at our local Churches in the upcoming months. All candidates must be sponsored by an existing Brother Knight in good standing.

By-Laws: Our Advocate, Patrick Carbonaro, has advised me that the current BY-Laws for both Council and Home Corp. require updating. Patrick has also reviewed same with our former Advocate, John Rossi. We will be working closely with Patrick, Jeff Gage, Mark Carr, Bruce Sherman, Pat Crawford, John Montone and Alex Vanderpool to begin the updating process. As a guide we will follow the current By-Law and Charter Constitution Laws received by Supreme. This is a significant process and work is still underway to complete. We will continue to update on progress in future newsletters and Council meetings. We are also required by Supreme to comply with newly established guidelines for Councils with Home Corps. This process remains ongoing and we anticipate a draft document sometime in 2020.

Grand Knight Suggestion Box: I am always interested in any and all suggestions and recommendations that are in the Best interest of Council 207. There is a Grand Knight Suggestion Box located at the table near the front door. Your input and ideas are welcome.

Christian Activities: We will continue to expand our involvement in Catholic Christian Activities throughout the year. Increased involvement by Council in activities at Tyburn Academy, St Albert The Great, Catholic Parishes, Champions for Life, Special Council Masses, Seminarians, Christian couple's events, Deacon Dennis Virtues events, local Pastors and Deacons, KOC Supreme special events and activities, Young men's group activities, etc. Important that we all work together to ensure success and sustainability for these projects now and in future years.

Work is complete in constructing a special permanent display area at the KOC to remind us all of our Catholic parishes and Catholic Christian affiliates and their roles in our faith community. Displays will be posted in the near future.

Notable Events: Planned events for 2020 - sports night - casino night - clam/seafood night, Old timers recognition dinner - Wine Tasting - bourbon tasting - Past Grand Knight cocktail hour - KOC Mass Dedication at Sacred Heart Church - Police Officers/Firemen recognition day - Pancake breakfasts - Mass at KOC - I have met with Father Brown at Sacred Heart/Saint Ann's and plans are also under way to host a "Special Mass" of recognition for Council 207. If anyone has Council 207 memorabilia, please advise me "ASAP" - Rosary prayer service prior to Council meetings - Membership drive local and after Masses - coffee hour after Masses - membership drive

Operation Enduring Gratitude 3: We have successfully launched our 3rd OEG3 event. Under the guidance of Dave Pappert we have identified several opportunities to raise donations for this "Very Special Event" to include - \$100.00 raffle - Summer clambake - Veterans Gala - Golf Tournament - Casino Night - Sale of commemorative shirts and hoodies - etc. - additional information to follow. Event and weekend trip to Washington is scheduled for Sept/Oct 2021.

NOTE: We are also looking for Veterans Memorabilia (hats-awards-medals-artifacts-pictures etc.) to display at The Knights. All will be displayed and secured in a glass case. Please contact Dave Pappert or Jack Baraczek for further info.

Operation Enduring Gratitude

Knights of Columbus Council #207 and our Ladies Auxiliary are very proud of the many charitable and service related projects our members are involved with. Through these efforts we are able to give back to our community, and more fully experience Knighthood in it's purest form. In this spirit Council #207 created "Operation Enduring Gratitude", a service project which hosts our area's World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam War veterans on first class, 3 day - 2 night trips to Washington, DC to experience the monuments and memorials that our grateful nation has constructed in their honor. The Council #207 family has raised over \$150K since 2010, and has successfully completed two Operation Enduring Gratitude trips in 2012 & 2017 providing life changing experiences for many of our local heroes.

We are excited to announce that Council #207 is embarking upon our third Operation Enduring Gratitude trip (OEG3).

There are several important ways the Council #207 family can help make OEG3 a success:

1. Assist with identifying WWII, Korean War, and Vietnam War veterans who have not already traveled with OEG, and encourage them to participate in our next trip. Some veterans may initially be reluctant to accept this gratitude, or may have health considerations that may be concerned about. It is important that we encourage them to consider this trip, as these memorials mean much less if the veterans they were built to honor cannot experience them with the camaraderie of their brothers in arms. We are limited to approximately 70 veterans for this trip so we encourage interested veterans to register right away. Registration forms are available at Council #207, or by contacting David Pappert at (315) 246-4258, or david.pappert@gmail.com
2. Make a donation to support OEG3. The cost of this trip will be approximately \$80K and even with the outstanding community support we receive - we simply cannot achieve our goal without the direct financial support from our Brother Knights and the Ladies Auxiliary. 3. Support our fundraisers over the next 18 months, these opportunities include our \$100 Raffle (tickets available now at Council #207), our OEG3 Clambake at Yawger Brook on August 14th, and our Gala Dinner Dance commemorating the 75th Anniversary of the end of World War II, and honoring our local WWII veterans, on November 13th (more details to follow).

Operation Enduring Gratitude is a tremendous opportunity for our Council #207 family to demonstrate our endless support of those who gave our nation a "blank check" to preserve freedom and our American way of life. 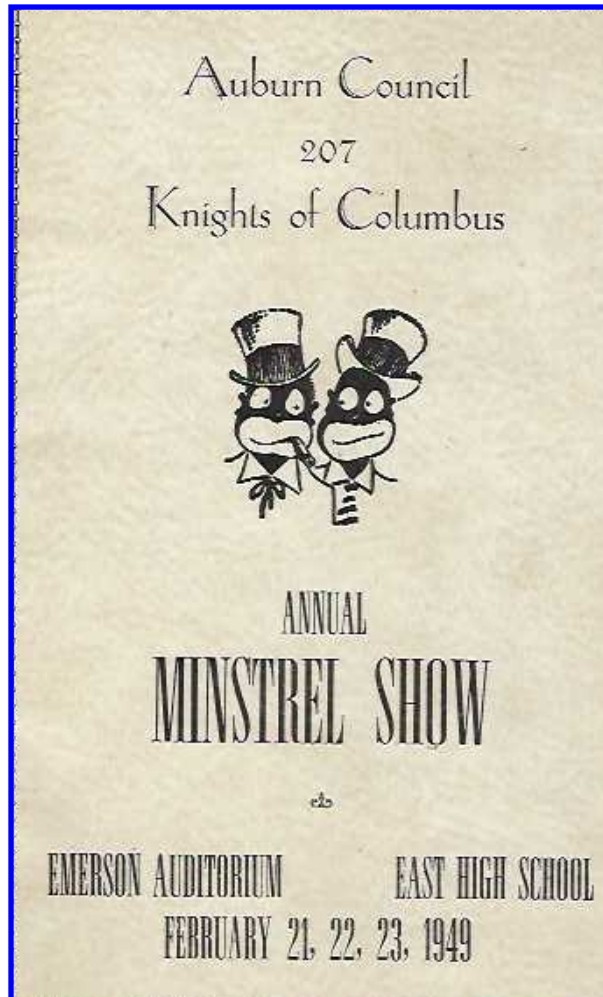
