Summer is over, what happened, kids back to school, vacations are but a memory and our busy season is under way. There are several events scheduled (please see information contained here in) and as always we are in need of your support, help and volunteers. Of note is the upcoming Breast Cancer Awareness month in October.

Though summer is slower at the Knights we, none the less, had a strong finish to the summer months. Though revenue was down approximately 10% we maintained a strong budget performance. Cost ratios vs buy remained steady and well with in industry standards. Margins continued to provide a steady increase to our bottom line. Our new fiscal budgets (July 1, 2018 - June 30, 2019) have been implemented and contain a modest increase in performance vs last year. Activities are increasing thru year end and into 2019. \$100.00 raffle tickets, C&B, Christmas appeal, Tyburn sports night with Jim Boenheim etc. are just a few. October is also Breast Cancer awareness month with several special events planned.

We had “Very Good Roof Project” donations and we met our budget requirements to replace our existing roof. The successful bidder was Apple (Andy Sheradon) . We anticipate completion of this project by October. A “Special Thanks” to all that helped to make this project a reality through you generous contributions. A meeting of Officers and Trustees was held over the summer to finalize this project. Specific details can be reviewed in the August Officers/Trustees meeting agenda and minutes.

Worthy Chaplains and Dear Brother Knights,

The issues that have come to light concerning sexual abuse by Archbishop Theodore McCarrick and in the Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report are cause for grave concern among Catholics and Brother Knights. Many feel deeply betrayed by those whom they long held in high regard. Such concerns are shared not just in the United States, but in Europe, Latin America and elsewhere.

These sins of commission and omission have sent the Church we love, the Church we serve and the Church that Jesus Christ established into convulsions. Sadly, the disgrace not only is borne by the perpetrators, it hurts us all, as does the silence of shepherds who have ignored the cries of their flocks.

There are many wonderful and faithful laborers in the vineyard of the Lord among our priests and bishops. However, it is clear that in addition to devastating criminal acts, we have seen many other moral failings by clergy that represent a crisis of commitment to the Gospel.

Too often the needs of victims have been subordinated to a distorted sense of mercy toward the perpetrators or an instinct for clerical self-preservation. The sexual acts — both criminal and non-criminal — highlight the need to recover a respect for and a renewed commitment to the priestly promises of celibacy.

The Knights of Columbus has supported the pastoral and charitable work of our bishops and priests since our founding by the Venerable Father Michael McGivney. We understand that the priest should lead the parish and the bishop should be the center of unity in a diocese. But we — like all Catholics — are painfully aware of the wreckage that ensues when elements of this leadership are abdicated by evil actions whether directly perpetrated or covered up.

Now, the Knights of Columbus — laymen, priests and chaplains together — will have an important role to play in rebuilding the Church. We must commit the Knights of Columbus to work for repentance, reform and rebuilding of the Church.

Repentance should include a full accounting of the misdeeds by those who have committed them. Archbishop McCarrick and others at fault owe us a full account of their actions, motivations and cover-ups. After years of having us confess to them, it is now time for them to come clean about what they have done and what they have failed to do.

This will also help increase the recognition that clerical sexual abuse is a global problem that must be addressed at the highest levels of the Catholic Church. Moreover, priests and bishops who refuse to live according to their promises of celibacy should be removed from public ministry, not out of retribution, but for the protection of the faithful and to prevent future variations of the scandal we now suffer.

Reform must include many good ideas that have been proposed, such as a full and complete investigation of sexual abuse led by an independent commission that includes laity; complete transparency by the Catholic hierarchy into all matters of criminal sexual misconduct past or future; an expansion of the zero tolerance policy to include sexual activity or misconduct by clerics including bishops, and by seminarians; and a call for faithfulness by all members of the clergy, including bishops. There must also be an independent ethics hotline for reporting of criminal and other conduct at odds with Catholic teaching on the clerical state of life; and there must be protections against retaliation.

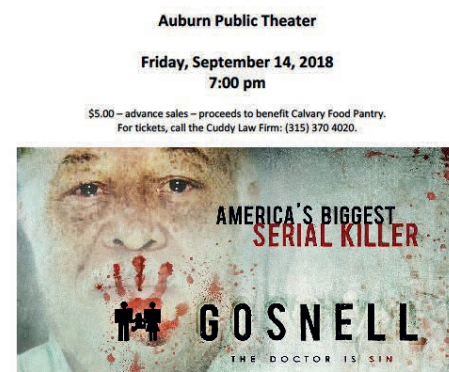

In 2013, Kermit Gosnell, MD, was convicted on three counts of the first-degree murder of infants born alive and for the involuntary manslaughter of an adult patient. He also was convicted of performing abortions beyond Pennsylvania's 24-week limit. Movie co-producer Ann McElhinney describes Gosnell as "America's biggest serial killer."

"Countless babies were born alive and then murdered," McElhinney said. "He is much worse than a psychopath. He's a greedy opportunist who found his opportunity in the abortion industry." McElhinney is adamant Gosnell "is not an outlier," despite claims to the contrary by abortion supporters. "Lots and lots and lots of people knew," McElhinney said. "There's such a web of protection for the abortion industry. It's beyond rationality to say that you have to take a hands-off approach to protect women's choice. This is what happens."

"It's very, very shocking, but there are also such wonderful heroes," McElhinney said. "Really marvelous people who did everything in their power to stop this."

Such reforms will be difficult for a Church largely unused to them, and we must support our bishops and our priests in embracing these reforms in order to rebuild.

We can help to rebuild our Church in several ways. Above all else, Knights — and our chaplains — must embrace love of God and love of neighbor. This is Christ's great commandment and the founding mission of our Order. It is also exactly the opposite of the rejection of God and exploitation of neighbor that our Church has witnessed in these scandals.

Shortly before becoming Pope Benedict XVI, Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger decried the "filth" in the Church "even among those, who in the priesthood, ought to belong totally" to Christ. He also provided the antidote, stating at other times that what the Church needs now more than anything else is "saints." Pope Francis reiterated Pope Benedict's sentiments in his letter on Aug. 20.

In the days ahead, the Knights of Columbus will help renew our Church on a national level through a Novena of Masses in reparation for these sins that have so grievously wounded the Body of Christ. I take this opportunity to ask that you offer this Novena of Masses for our Church at your earliest opportunity.

Beginning in November, the Knights of Columbus will sponsor, in cooperation with the Shrine of St. Jean Vianney in Ars, France, a national tour of the relic of the heart of this great patron saint of priests. In the coming weeks, I will share more details with you about this initiative.

We will also continue to strengthen and rebuild our Church at the level of our families and parishes through our Building the Domestic Church program. Its twin elements of imbuing families with faith and strengthening parish life are critical to providing a Catholic Church that rebuilds based on the Gospel principles of love of God and love of neighbor. Together with our recently announced "Faith In Action" initiative, we will strive to make our parishes truly become, in the words of Pope Francis, "a family of families."

Now is the time for all brother Knights to stand steadfast in faith, as Catholics and as gentlemen. We will assist priests, bishops and our fellow Catholics in helping the Church chart a course for the future that puts Christ at the center, so that truly we may say, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

This is the moment in which Knights — including in a special way our priest members — can be part of a great renewal for good in our Church. And as we strive to follow the Lord more closely in the days ahead, may he deliver us from every evil and in his mercy graciously grant his Church peace and unity.

In closing, know that your faithful witness and sacrifice can bring inspiration and hope to millions of your fellow Catholics. It will be needed in the days ahead more than ever before. And to every priest and bishop whose commitment and dedication to our Order and to our Church has been faithful and exemplary, please accept my gratitude in both a personal way and on behalf of the Knights of Columbus.

Let each one of us prayerfully invoke the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, so that in the words of St. Maximilian Kolbe, our hearts would be cleansed and themselves become immaculate, similar and like unto her own heart.

Blessed Solanus Casey Doorway Ministry:

The *Blessed Solanus Casey Doorway Ministry* will be opening at Saints Mary & Martha Parish Office at 299 Clark Street (next to St. Francis Church) in September. The new ministry is a response to Pope Francis call for the Church to be a field hospital and is the latest initiative of the New Evangelization efforts in Cayuga County.

The ministry will be modeled after employee assistance programs found in the workplaces which offer information and referral resources to assist individuals to gain control over a wide range of issues found in everyday life. The difference is that practical options will be combined with spiritual solutions to give a more effective approach to address the issues long term and to improve one’s effectiveness as a Catholic Christian. Next week you will hear about Bl. Solanus Casey.

News and Views: Results year over year continue to be very favorable, YTD August 2018 vs YTD August 2017 for both Council and Home Corp are within our fiscal budgets. Buy vs gross % continue as “Best in Class”. The average past 3 months gross vs spend averaged 35% or 15% better, vs the industry average of 41%. Every % of improvement = increased profits for Council and increased charitable contributions. Our financial committee continues to meet each month. Mark Carr provides an update on our fiscal performance, YTD, for both Council and Home Corp. Detailed financial updates are available at monthly Council meetings. Our fiscal budget for 2018/19 (July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019) is complete. All looks very positive and we are panning on growth of approximately 7%.

Activities beginning in September are on the increase. Many organizations are booking their events/meetings well into 2018 with some now in 2019. It is very important that you contact Don Poole well in advance when booking an event. A debit/credit system was approved by Home Corp. We are in the final stages of comparing several systems and will report on our findings. We will delay implementation until the 4th quarter of 2018.

Our physical building is in need of repair over the next 1-5 years. In addition to the new roof we are in need of the following - painting inside and out - repair of outside rear wall - stove repair or replacement - coat parking lot - remove and replace rear landscaping - security system - new computer - reconfigure kitchen - replace ice machine - replace air conditioner (21 years old) - more to come on these items. Over time we will establish a budget and timeline and all will require Council approval.

Building Fund New Roof: So far we have received \$28,000 + from 120 individuals. Thanks to all for your contributions. Our roof campaign is considered a “Special” building fund campaign given the costs associated for this major project. We are also expected to incur additional maintenance costs to our building this year beyond the roof project and anticipate that we can cover these costs thru the existing building fund. Our roof campaign will continue to run thru October (completion and install of new roof) We will continue to accept contributions thru end of October.

Degree Updates:

We have a place holder for another 1st Degree on September 25 depending on applications and commitments. Additional detail to follow. We will conduct 2 additional First and Second degrees in 2018. Details to follow. Contacts: 1st and 2nd Degree - Jack Baraczek at 315-415-5325, Bruce Sherman 315 567-9677, Joe LoPiccolo, 315-246-8943, ASAP, for details. Pre-registration is required.

By-Laws: Our Advocate, Patrick Carbonaro, has advised me that the current BY-Laws for both Council and Home Corp. require updating. Patrick has also reviewed same with our former Advocate, John Rossi. We will be working closely with Patrick, Jeff Gage, Mark Carr, Bruce Sherman, Pat Crawford, John Montone and Alex Vanderpool to begin the updating process. As a guide we will follow the current BY-Law and Charter Constitution Laws received by Supreme. This is a significant process and work is still underway to complete. We will continue to update on progress in future newsletters and Council meetings. We are also required by Supreme to comply with newly established guidelines for Councils with Home Corps.

Additional Council members: Our goal will be to add 50 new 1st Degree members in 2018. This will require adding 12-14 new members each quarter. We will also encourage current 2nd and 3rd Degree Members to move to the net level. The Ladies Auxiliary has also increased their membership to 170 and anticipate continued growth in 2018.

New look: Improvements and reconfigurations continue at Council. Reconfiguration of the back office will complete our updating by year end. Volunteers needed for some sweat equity to refresh the outside of our building along with some painting and general housekeeping.

September 2018 Virtue in the Home

Faith

The glossary in the Catechism of the Catholic Church defines faith as “both a gift of God and a human act by which the believer gives personal adherence to God who invites his response, and freely assents to the whole truth that God has revealed. It is this revelation of God which the Church proposes for our belief, and which we profess in the Creed, celebrate in the sacraments, live by right conduct that fulfills the twofold commandment of charity (as specified in the ten commandments), and respond to in our prayer of faith. Faith is both a theological virtue given by God as grace, and an obligation which flows from the first commandment of God”.

Spending a few minutes studying this definition you can see why attending Mass every Sunday in the proper frame of mind and with preparation and follow through is one of the best means for building a strong faith foundation in your children that will benefit them in every aspect of their lives going forward. The value of a strong faith is not simply a church teaching but a major finding of positive psychology which focuses not on treatment of weaknesses but rather upon the building of strengths in the person. In a 2015 book entitled *Faith from a Positive Psychology Perspective*, faith is considered a character strength that contributes to optimal living, well being and “the good life”. If that is the life your wish for your children, don’t ask the family if we are going to Mass on Sunday but rather ask which Mass are we going to! There are local Masses from 4 PM on Saturday to 5 PM on Sunday and if all else fails take a short family outing to Cornell in Ithaca for the 9 PM Mass on Sunday!
