On another note I feel compelled to address an unfortunate situation that has propelled the Knights of Columbus into the national political spotlight. Recently two of our United States Senators questioned a judicial nominee about his membership in the Knights of Columbus citing as disqualifiers his Catholicism and his affiliation with the Knights of Columbus. This is not the 1st time that people have questioned whether Catholics could be good citizens or honest public servants. One only needs to visit a local cemetery or Arlington National Cemetery to view the thousands of graves of our servicemen and women, many of whom are Catholics, who sacrificed and gave their lives for this Great Country and are Great Citizens.

From our very beginning, the Knights of Columbus has been an organization adhering to the teachings of the Catholic Church. Our primary motivation is Christ's great commandment that we love God and our neighbor as we would ourselves. This love guides us to do our great charitable giving on behalf of those in need either in the inner cities of the US or in refugee camps around the world. Our donations over the last decade equal over \$1 billion dollars as well as hundreds of million of hours in volunteer work. Each year our local Council 207 contributes thousands of dollars and hundreds of volunteer hours in support of our local community.

Article VI of the US Constitution forbids a religious test for public office. The 1st Amendment guarantees our free exercise of religion, freedom of association and freedom of speech. Any suggestion that the Knights adherence to the beliefs of the Catholic Church makes a Brother Knight unfit for office violates our constitutional rights.

In closing, let us all continue to express our love of God and neighbor. Let us continue to help those in need and stand by our Church and Faith.

From our founding Father McGivney and our core virtues of Charity - Unity - Fraternity - Patriotism we are reminded that a good Catholic is a Good Citizen. As Catholics we will show civility, good judgement and dignity even in the face of prejudice.

Knights are lovers of God

Since the Knights of Columbus recently became a political issue, I've seen a constant refrain on social media that goes something along the lines of: "What do you mean, the pancake breakfast guys?" The point being: Could you be picking on nicer guys? But the Knights' goodness goes far beyond breakfast items. The Knights of Columbus are about virtue and service. The United States – and the world – would not be the same without them.

The Knights became an issue when two Senate Democrats questioned a judicial nominee about his membership in the Knights. Hawaii Democrat Rep. Tulsi Gabbard deserves some kind of adult-in-the-room award for resisting such a cheap attack.

"While I oppose the nomination of Brian Buescher to the U.S. District Court in Nebraska, I stand strongly against those who are fomenting religious bigotry, citing as disqualifiers Buescher's Catholicism and his affiliation with the Knights of Columbus," she wrote. Her op-ed was courageous and important, as religious bigotry is not a passing issue. It's an ideological position that would have people who take their religious duties seriously relegated to a second class, punished for truly exercising their religious liberty. Think of the Little Sisters of the Poor having to go to the Supreme Court to protect their rights during the Barack Obama administration, or the City of Philadelphia severing ties with Catholic Social Services.

In a series of videos last year, the Knights highlighted some "everyday heroes." It wasn't so much a commercial for the organization – though it certainly couldn't hurt – as a challenge to us all to be better. That's what the Knights are about. They make money helping families with life insurance and spend it helping families. They help men know how to be good husbands and fathers who care about what's going on in their communities. They help families rebuild after a hurricane. They've advocated for and helped displaced Middle Eastern Christians rebuild in the face of a genocide there that most of the country is ignoring.

They are good neighbors. They are mentors.

Carl Anderson, the head of the Knights of Columbus since 2009, wrote one of the most sensible books about politics in recent years, "Beyond a House Divided." Backed by deep-dive polls the Knights have been commissioning for over a decade now, he nudges us toward a better way, finding opportunities for common ground on some of the most contentious issues of the day.

As the Knights were in the news, I was at the cathedral of St. Peter and St. Paul in Indianapolis, as 3,000 people waited in long lines to venerate a relic, the incorrupt heart of Saint John Vianney. Vianney was a priest full of love for God's people. Whatever you think of such pious practices and relics, the scene was remarkable, and very K of C: Families of all ages were there, with at least three generations in many cases. I saw one active military man, sitting in the front row, praying. There were people from different income brackets, professions and walks of life.

That night after Mass, the relic moved on to the Fellowship of Catholic University Students SEEK conference, with over 17,000, mostly college students, in attendance.

Just as soon as I returned to New York, a friend texted me a picture of her view of the same relic in a parish church in Columbus, Ohio. That heart is doing more to restore Catholic hearts in this time of scandal than we can ever know or understand – drawing us to prayer, rooting us in history, inspiring others.

The Knights are far from an "extremist" group. To the contrary, we need more people like them. Thankfully, they're a part of American life. May their ranks only grow, and may we learn to treasure opportunities for virtuous fellowship and civic service encouraging us to be our fullest and best.

News and Views: Results year over year continue to be very favorable, YTD January 2019 vs YTD December 2018 for both Council and Home Corp are within our fiscal budgets. Buy vs gross % continue as "Best in Class". The average past 3 months gross vs spend = 31%, vs the industry average of 41%. Our best performance to date. Every % of improvement = increased profits for Council and increased charitable contributions. Our financial committee continues to meet each month. Mark Carr provides an update on our fiscal performance, YTD, for both Council and Home Corp. Detailed financial updates are available at monthly Council meetings. Home Corp. is current with all obligations to Council. Based upon performance, additional \$'s are being allocated from Home Corp. to Council in support of our initiatives and charitable contributions.

Activities in January were very strong. 38 events scheduled in January. Our rental contributions are the highest in several years. Many organizations are booking their events/meetings into 2019. It is very important that you contact Don Poole well in advance when booking an event. A debit/credit system was approved by Home Corp. We will delay implementation until we are fully staffed with additional bartenders. Our physical building is in need of repair over the next 1-5 years. In addition to the new roof we are in need of the following - painting inside and out - repair of outside rear wall - stove repair or replacement - coat parking lot - remove and replace rear landscaping - security system - new computer - reconfigure kitchen - replace ice machine - replace air conditioner (21 years old) repair outside walls, etc.. All have been identified at Council meetings and with in our finance committee . Plans are under way to prioritize and set up a schedule to proactively address all issues over the next 5 years. We will establish a budget and timeline and all will require Council approval. The financial committee met on January 30th to review the time frame to complete and the path forward.

Building Fund New Roof: Our special roof project is complete. We will have a special dedication ceremony, recognition and party for all that participated and donated. 1st qtr 2019

Degree Updates: We completed a 1st Degree on January 9 at Council - 9 candidates completed their 1st Degree Ceremony. We are planning a 2nd Degree Ceremony during April/May. (Details to follow)

Membership Transfers: We have and will continue to welcome all transfers in good standing from the St Frances Council and have already processed 16 transfers. Council 207 has an opportunity to except transfers from approximately 60 Brothers. If you know of any Brothers from the St Frances Council that have questions regarding transfer process please have them contact either Matt Fallon (Gr Knight St Frances) or Myself. In the coming months I will post a list of new member transfers.

Membership: With the addition of 9 new 1st Degree members + 16 transfer members from St. Francis we have added 25 members to Council 207 - a very good start to 2019. Thanks to Mark Carr and the Degree Team for a job well done.

By-Laws: Our Advocate, Patrick Carbonaro, has advised me that the current BY-Laws for both Council and Home Corp. require updating. Patrick has also reviewed same with our former Advocate, John Rossi. We will be working closely with Patrick, Jeff Gage, Mark Carr, Bruce Sherman, Pat Crawford, John Montone and Alex Vanderpool to begin the updating process. As a guide we will follow the current BY-Law and Charter Constitution Laws received by Supreme. This is a significant process and work is still underway to complete. We will continue to update on progress in future newsletters and Council meetings. We are also required by Supreme to comply with newly established guidelines for Councils with Home Corps. This process remains ongoing and we anticipate a draft document within the 1st qtr of 2019.

Additional Council members: Plans are also underway to hold KOC Council 207 membership drives at the end of each Parish Mass early in 2019. We will be meeting with all parish priests in our area to review our program and obtain the necessary permission to proceed. We are also proposing to provide a coffee hour each quarter after Masses.

Grand Knight Suggestion Box: I am always interested in any and all suggestions and recommendations that are in the Best interest of Council 207. There is a Grand Knight Suggestion Box located at the table near the front door. Your input and ideas are welcome.

Christian Activities: We will continue to expand our involvement in Catholic Christian Activities throughout the year. Increased involvement by Council in activities at Tyburn Academy, St Joseph, Catholic Parishes, Champions for Life, Special Council Masses, Seminarians, Christian couple's events, Deacon Dennis Virtues events, local Pastors and Deacons, KOC Supreme special even and activities, Young men's group activities, etc. Important that we all work together to ensure success and sustainability for these projects now and in future years.

Work is complete in constructing a special permanent display area at the KOC to remind us all of our Catholic parishes and Catholic Christian affiliates and their roles in our faith community. Displays will be posted in the near future.

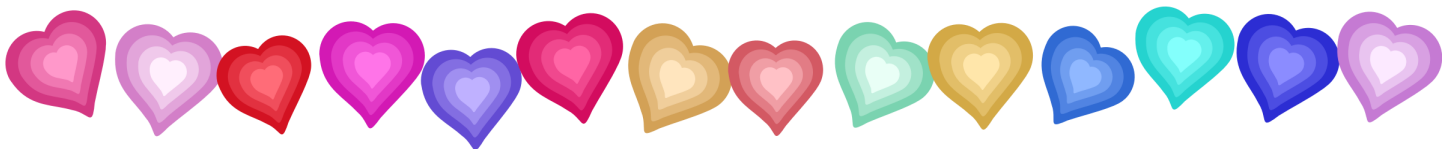

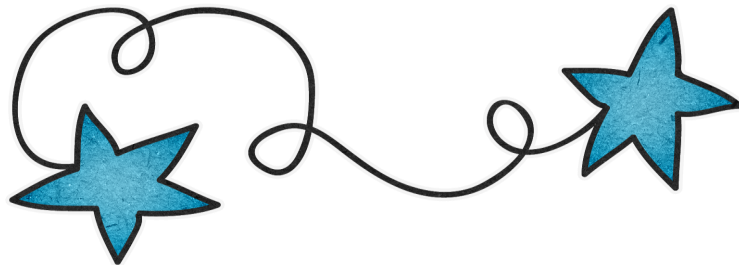
